# Trade by Numbers

#### Section 301

- Addresses foreign unfair trading practices
- U.S. investigation of China's intellectual property and forced tech transfer practices
- Tariffs and retaliation

#### • Section 232

- President may adjust imports of a product if they are in quantities or circumstances that threaten or impair the national security
- U.S. investigation of imports of steel and aluminum
- Tariffs and retaliation

#### Section 201

- President may impose tariffs or other temporary measures if a surge in imports is a substantial cause or threat of serious injury to U.S. producers
- U.S. industry petitioned for relief on washing machines and solar panels

# A Look Ahead – Trade Negotiations

#### • USMCA

- Signing expected by end of November
- Likely for next Congress to consider

### • Japan, UK, and EU

- Japan: negotiations starting in mid-January 2019
- UK: waiting for completion of Brexit process
- EU: narrower focus
- TPA and Role of Congress
