Have a greater impact in the regulatory process

- We begin formulating potential changes to statute or rule six months prior to the legislative session
- Our intent is to involve the affected stakeholders in that process
- Brainstorming sessions, working groups, rules hearings
- Board of Ag, Legislature, Governor

- Producer Groups
  - Don't just interact a rule making time
  - Attend meetings, or invite the SAHO to your meetings
  - Relationships are important
