Richardson Receives AALA Excellence in Agricultural Law Award for Academia

Jesse J. Richardson Jr., professor of law at the West Virginia University College of Law and lead land use attorney at the Land Use and Sustainable Development Law Clinic, received an Excellence in Agricultural Law Award for Academia from the American Agricultural Law Association on Oct. 26 during the association's annual conference in Portland, Oregon.

The AALA's Excellence in Agricultural Law Awards recognize AALA members for outstanding contributions to the legal profession and the agricultural community. These awards may acknowledge members from professional sectors, including private practice, academia, government and non-governmental organizations.

"Jesse strives to make the academic world a bit more exciting for his students and to share his passion for the industry," said AALA president Jennifer Zwagerman of Drake University Law School. "His work helps inspire the next generation of professionals."

Graduating magna cum laude from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, Richardson earned a bachelor's degree in agricultural economics in 1984 and a master's degree in agricultural and applied economics in 1996. He earned a Juris Doctorate from the University of Virginia School of Law in 1987.

His previous positions include serving as a faculty member at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, in general practice for nine years emphasizing environmental and agricultural law, and as a lecturer in the University of Virginia School of Law.

Richardson has been recognized with a University Award for Outreach Excellence as well as the William E. Wine Award for Excellence in Teaching and the University Certificate of Teaching Excellence in the College of Architecture and Urban Studies at Virginia Tech. He also received the AALA Professional Scholarship award in 1999. He has served on the AALA Board of Directors and was president in 2014-15. He also served on the board of directors for the National Cave and Karst Research Institute and the Universities Council on Water Resources. He serves on the board of the Water Well Trust.
